- ✓ watch your small appliances; they may be big energy wasters

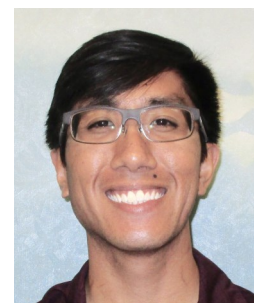
