She gave us a history of Sadako Sasaki who succumbed to leukemia due to the effects of the atomic bombing of Hiroshima. Her quest was to fold a 1,000 cranes to be granted a wish. As we get ready to welcome 2021, we wish for peace throughout our nation and the world. We wrote messages of peace onto the wings of the cranes, sharing a little Aloha from Hawaii. Our club members and our SLP helped to fold 366 cranes which were given to Ms. Taezu (left in photo on the right). She will forward our cranes to the Hiroshima Peace Memorial Museum. Nanette Kiyota (center) and daughter Shaylynn (right) were also at our virtual service project. Shaylynn is a former Pearl City Key Club.



Hi Division 22!


