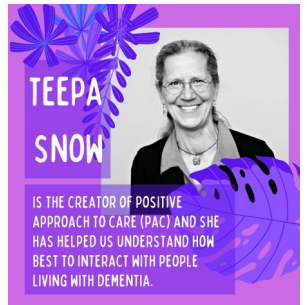

The Pearl Harbor Kiwanis helped with **The Salvation Army** food distribution at Kroc Center on Thu, March 25 from 10:00a-11:30a. About 576 families were served with this food distribution. As always, The Salvation Army planned a well organized drive-thru for the safety of all families being served as well as the volunteers. Produce, meats, milk and eggs were among food items distributed as well as prayers and blessings. Kay helped double wrap the flats of eggs. More than 17,000 eggs were given out. Another volunteer was Julie, former Aiea Key Club President. It was great to see a former Key Clubber continue the commitment to giving back to the community! The next food drive-thru will be Friday, April 30.



March is **Women’s History Month**. Our Waipahu Key Club invited us to join them in a service project to create infographics to highlight contributions of women to events in history and contemporary society. The women our Key Clubbers chose to honor included *Michelle Obama, Beyonce, Jane Austen, Amelia Earhart, Harriet Tubman, Cecilia Chung, Greta Thunberg*, et al. Carol did one on *Whoopi Goldberg* for breaking through the color barrier. Kay did one on *Teepa Snow*, occupational therapist and a leading education on how to care for people living with dementia. These projects allow us to get to know our SLP members, share stories and understand what’s important in their lives, as well as learn new tools. They introduced and showed us how to use *Canva*, an online graphic design tool.



Our **Kiwaniis dolls** were donated along with children’s books from the CNH Red, White & Brews fundraiser. This month’s recipient of the dolls and books was the Children’s Justice Center on Oahu. This is the state’s largest center, serving 1,100 children each year ranging in age from 2 to 18. Their goal is to make sure our keiki can move forward in life free from harm. They exist so that every child victim of violence or abuse has equal access to holistic resources and treatment. We are glad to support CJC and the keiki they serve.

Improving the World One Child and One Community at a Time



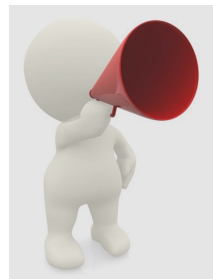
The monthly Division 22 DCM was held on Tue, March 16 via Zoom.
